A CENTURY OF OUTDOOR LEARNING

Camp Kawartha was first established in 1921 by the Rotary Club of Peterborough and operated as both a Rotary Camp and a YMCA Camp until 1985. Since then, Camp Kawartha has grown to a year round operation that teaches more than 16,000 visitors, students, campers, parents, educators and community leaders per year. Camp Kawartha has earned 19 awards for its work in fostering stewardship and environmental awareness. The organization is a registered, not-for-profit charity that is governed by an independent Board of Directors. Presently, the Camp operates as an outdoor and environmental learning centre from two locations: The Camp Kawartha Environment Centre adjacent to Trent University and from its main site on the shores of Clear Lake approximately 30 km north of Peterborough, Ontario. CAMP KAWARTHA (CK) TODAY

- Through its environment centre and outdoor education centre, CK delivers more than 80 innovative outdoor and environmental programs linked to the Ontario Curriculum to students from Kindergarten to Grade 12. CK Educators use engaging teaching strategies including citizen science, drama, outdoor exploration, storytelling and inquiry based learning.
- CK offers a variety of programs on ecology, nature connection, carbon reduction and demonstrates green living in action at the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre, one of Canada's most sustainable buildings.
- During the summer, CK delivers rich nature based, environmental camps on its main site, at the Environment Centre and outreach camps in partnership with four cottager's associations.

- In partnership with Trent University, Fleming College and Ontario Eco Schools, CK offers certification programs for student teachers, early childhood educators and current teachers, teaching best practices in environmental education.
- CK also:
 - Delivers hands-on workshops on sustainable living to the general public.
 - Provides water stewardship programming in partnership with Otonabee Conservation
 - Offers a Forest Kindergarten, Forest Fridays for Homeschoolers and an Oaks and Acorns program for Moms and Tots
 - Provides sponsorship and subsidies for Kids in Need.

CAMP KAWARTHA INNOVATES:

In consultation with over 40 organizations including First Nations, Trent University, Fleming College, public health, conservation authorities, school boards and early childhood educators, Camp Kawartha has created a model for stewardship education for every age and stage of a

child's development. Called the *Pathway to Stewardship and Kinship*, this project has been featured in a number of articles and books as an exemplar



of innovative environmental education. The Pathways approach has been cited in a UN report called *Home to Us All: How Connecting with Nature Helps Us Care for Ourselves and the Earth.*

CK is proud to have **played a lead role**, along with Peterborough GreenUP and other organizations in helping to establish the Kawartha/Peterborough/ Haliburton area as a **UNESCO (The United Nations**)

> Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) Regional Centre of Expertise (RCE) in Sustainability Education. The Pathways to Stewardship

and Kinship helps to realize one of the six major objectives, which is: "To implement age-appropriate sustainability and stewardship education frameworks from pre-school to secondary school, in both formal and informal settings".

CAMP KAWARTHA RENEWAL:

This is an opportunity to invest in new infrastructure that is at the very forefront of green design; investments that will help establish Camp Kawartha as a national leader in environmental education. THE PRIORITIES

CENTRAL HUB - AN EXAMPLE OF A LIVING BUILDING IN ACTION:

With your help, Camp Kawartha will build one of the first fully certified Living Buildings in Canada. A Living Building is like a tree. And just like a tree, a Living Building produces more energy than it uses. It uptakes carbon and creates habitat. Using only non-toxic materials, a Living Building integrates nature and beauty in every element of its design. A Living Building harvests water from the footprint it occupies. It produces much of its own food and the surrounding area is more nature rich and more biodiverse then before construction. A living building demonstrates how people and nature can live together so that both can thrive.

The Camp Kawartha Living Building will replace the Camp's aging Dining Hall and will provide additional overnight accommodations. Fully accessible, this innovative hub will:

- Showcase what is possible in sustainable and regenerative design to campers, students, teachers, parents, community leaders, camps, outdoor centres, architects and builders. Each element of the Living Building will be a teaching tool from rain water harvesting to alternative forms of energy, from non-toxic materials to food production and passive solar design, the building will be an exemplar of zero carbon design.
- Be an inspiring venue for:
 - Training young leaders to adopt and teach sustainable and regenerative living strategies.
- Delivering award winning environmental programming,
- Providing teacher training and workshops on sustainable living and nature education, regionally, provincially and nationally.
- Demonstrate how biodiversity can be enhanced by adopting living building principles.
- Become a showpiece for Peterborough/Haliburton Regional Centre of Expertise in sustainability education and CK's Pathway to Stewardship and Kinship Initiative.

CARBON, WASTE AND TOXINS

NET ZERO HEALTH CENTRE:

Replacing our aging, poorly insulated health centre with an innovative net Zero Health Centre (zero carbon, zero waste and zero toxins) will help CK look after the health needs of students, campers and visitors. This space would be an exemplar of how health clinics can be more sustainable, healthy and how they can integrate nature into their design. An increasing body of research is showing the physical and mental health benefits of regular and sustained contact with nature.

GREEN WASTE WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM:

With your help, CK will upgrade its waste water management system, replacing the current aging septic system which is at the end of its useful life. The proposed system is the greenest permitted by the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks. This will also enable CK to modestly expand its capacity by 25%, reaching an extra 3,500 campers, students, visitors and workshop participants per year.

REGENERATING GREEN SPACE:

Your investment will help us create a large organic food and pollinator garden and increase the biodiversity in and around the property. These gardens will teach and inspire visitors to understand the importance of healthy, local food and the critical role pollinators play in enhancing biodiversity. As Aldo Leopold once said *"the healthiest food is the shortest distance from the earth to your mouth."*
