### **Message from the Executive Director:**

## **Bouncing Back...**

Being resilient is the ability to bounce back in the face of challenge and adversity. And that is exactly what Camp Kawartha has managed to achieve this fiscal year. Some of you may recall the difficulty our organization faced at the end of 2013. In large part, due to a Province wide Teacher's Work Action – field trips to outdoor centres such as ours were effectively suspended. The result was a significant drop in revenue. However, thanks to the hard work of our office staff and the excellent programs delivered by our Summer Camp, Outdoor Education and Environment Centre personnel, we've witnessed an impressive



bounce back! In fact, this fiscal year, we achieved total revenue increases of over 17% in all departments, for a total of more than 1.5 million dollars. Boosting our revenue has meant that we have been able to increase our capacity, helping us to reach over 13,000 adults and children. By any measure, in a region of 150,000 inhabitants, that is an impressive reach! 13,000 people are recognizing the importance of stewardship – they are being exposed to practical and inspiring ideas to help them care for one another and for the natural world. A quick review of our testimonials attests to the quality and relevance of our programming. From our outreach environmental camps, to our rich summer camp and outdoor programming; from cutting edge environmental framework to our Eco Mentor program for student teachers, we are fostering a culture of stewardship in our region and beyond. 





# **Facts and Figures:**









### An overview of our accomplishments over the 2013-2014 Fiscal Year:

- 1. **Camp Renewal:** Thank you to our maintenance team and our contractors for continuing to upgrade Camp Kawartha. During the last fiscal year, we invested over **\$127,000** in **capital improvements.** Here are some highlights:
  - Complete interior renovation of two sleeping cabins **Seneca and Siniwick**. Includes rewiring, insulating, pine floors and walls, new heating and lighting.
  - Provided new walls and roof for our Yurt
  - Stabilized the Emergency Hill with tiered limestone blocking.
  - Purchased a newer school bus the "Blue Dragon" for our summer camp tripping program
  - Upgraded waterfront equipment including new kayaks, canoes and windsurf boards
  - Established a Camp Radio Station.
  - **New metal roofs** were installed on: our Health Centre, Tent Platform, Siniwick and Seneca. A special thanks to **Mike Evans** for his generous donation!
  - Repaved the basketball court
- 2. **Marketing Update:** Due to the hard work of our Marketing Intern, **Michelle Beattie** and the contributions from our **office staff**, we were able to:
  - Promote Outdoor Education to 19 school boards;
    - o 1,268 schools potentially reached; 652,028 students potentially reached
  - Promote our "Be a Water Steward Program" in partnership with ORCA to 2 local school boards (130 schools and approximately 48,000 students)
  - Highlight our winter programming to over **140 private schools** in Ontario
  - Promote Outdoor Education in English to 32 private schools in Quebec (targeted 63 contacts within these schools)
  - Our office team developed a new Facility Rental Brochure which we distributed to over 520 rental groups.



3. **Revised Website:** Thanks to **Karen Copson**, our recently redesigned website has increased in views over the past year from **49,112 annual visits to 86,556 annual visits** – a **75% increase!** The feedback we've received from teachers, parents and rental inquiries, is that the site is much easier to navigate, professional looking and cleaner than our previous website.



4. **Capacity Building**: As a result of our marketing efforts and the excellent job of managing bookings by our office staff, our **outdoor education revenue increased** by **60%**, our **Summer** 

Camp Revenues by 8% and our Facility Rentals
Revenues by 26% from 2013 to 2014. This has
resulted in a surplus of close to \$70,000 for 2014.
Extra revenue is important as we embark on our
Site and Facilities Master Plan and as we review
the compensation levels of our staff to ensure that
they are consistent with industry standards.



- 5. Summer Camp Subsidy and Sponsorship: Thanks to the generosity of a variety of donors, businesses and foundations, we were able to provide \$76,000 in funding to help 87 children in need, participate in the magic of summer camp. We'd especially like to thank the Rotary Club of Peterborough and the hard work of Judge Alan Ingram for providing Camp Kawartha with close to \$10,000 in sponsorship funding. Together we worked with Prince of Wales Public School, the Kawartha-Haliburton Children's Aid Society, and Big Brothers Big Sisters to select children whose families simply could not afford a summer camp experience. Thanks to this funding, we were able to sponsor an additional 23 children for

- 7. Summer Camp: Thanks to Adam Strasberg, our exemplary Summer Camp Director and his talented staff, summer camp 2014 was our fullest year to date and they made it one of the best! Among the highlights:
  - 556 overnight campers registered
  - 196 day campers registered including the second year of Kinder Camp
  - 49 Leadership campers participated in 4
     week leadership sessions including Counselor
     Skills Development, Leader in Training and Wilderness Skills Development.
  - Total camper registrations exceeded 2013 by 6 %
- 8. **Summer Camp Outreach**: For the second year in a row we were able to run **two additional outreach environmental camps** that were inspired by the summer camps held at the Environment Centre. We were able to teach an additional **95 campers** about nature, sustainability and stewardship through our external camping sessions including:
  - Three one week Environment Camps at Juniper Island (in partnership with the Association of Stoney Lake Cottagers). This expanded from one week last year.
  - Two one week Environment Camps in partnership with the Wollaston Cottager's Association in Coe Hill, Ontario.
  - Environment programming delivered at Beavermead Park in partnership with the Otonabee Region Conservation Authority (ORCA).
- 9. We continue to deliver our "Be A Water Steward" Program to elementary and secondary students in partnership with the Otonabee Region Conservation Authority. 998 students learned about water conservation, sustainable living and participated in direct environmental action by rehabilitating and planting wetlands and shorelines. By planting native species, we



increase bio-diversity and we improve the water quality and health within our watershed. We've planted over **31,800 square meters** of shoreline. Here is a summary of what has been planted so far by students participating in the Be A Water Steward Program:

- 10. Environmental Framework. We are meeting with School Board officials, teachers, environmental leaders and interested stakeholders in our community to develop a framework for the whole community. The intent is that every student, throughout their development will be exposed to age appropriate environmental education delivered by Camp Kawartha along with our community partners. It is our hope that by the time students graduate from High School in our region, they will receive the knowledge, training and skills to become future stewards.
- 11. Rotary Canoe Trip: Camp Kawartha partnered with the Rotary Club of Peterborough-Kawartha and Curve Lake First Nations to offer unique wilderness experience for youth. First Nations and non-First Nations Youth participated in "Adventures in Understanding" a five day canoe trip focusing on First Nations history and cross cultural awareness. Led by our own talented Glen Caradus, the program was a great success. Several articles appeared in the Examiner and the story was picked up by CBC on Ontario



Morning. We are working with Peterborough Tourism to offer the trip again in June – this time for **travel writers** from all over the world as part of an international conference.

12. The Apple Cider Story: Over the past year, youth at risk from the John Howard Society made two wonderful apple cider presses for Camp Kawartha. First, in order to raise the funds necessary to construct the presses, the students made over 100 blue bird boxes and sold these at our local market and at the Environment Centre. Next students from Holy Cross Secondary School forged the metal components (hoops, grinders, handles). The Youth worked with a skilled carpenter to learn how to make an apple cider press. In late September we had an Apple Festival at the Environment



Centre. Over **120 people** came to see the presses unveiled and to make fresh cider. The students who worked on the project were honored. This was a wonderful **coming together** of our community to help at risk youth learn important life and job related skills and experience the joy of giving back to their community. Camp Kawartha will be able to use the presses to teach children about the **importance of local food.** 

- 13. **Wild Rice:** Thanks to a donation from **James Whetung** and the efforts of Glen Caradus, Camp Kawartha will be establishing a **wild rice bed** in our bay. Wild rice was once a common and important native food source for wildlife in this region.
- 14. **Camp Store:** Thanks largely to efforts of Karen Copson and our Office Staff, this fiscal year we've been able to sell a total of **\$19,000** in giftshop merchandise. We try to select environmentally friendly memorabilia for campers and students. We have a plan in place to expand the store and to develop our online presence, enabling parents to pre-order for summer. We are also developing a smoother, more efficient point-of-sale payment system. This is a welcome and growing stream of revenue for the camp.
- **15. Award:** Camp Kawartha received a 2014 **Peterborough Business Excellence Award for Environment Practices.** An award such as this helps to raise our profile in our community and legitimizes the good work we are doing in delivering our mission of creating positive stewards. It both strengthens our reputation and celebrates our staff's hard work and commitment to excellence.



- 16. **Camp Kawartha Environment Centre:** Our Environment Centre continues to inspire. Here are some highlights:
  - **2,572 elementary and high school students** participated in environmental programming in the 5<sup>th</sup> year of the Center's operations. That makes for a total of **7,617 campers**, **students**, **student teachers and adults** who have visited the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre during year 5. That is an increase of more than 60% over last year.
  - Since opening, the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre has directly taught 11,975 High School and Elementary students about sustainable living, energy conservation and ecology. More than 1,837 University Students and Student Teachers have participated in environmental education workshops and at least 26,617 people have visited the Environment Centre (a total of tours, students, student teachers and rental groups over the past 5 years).
  - Thanks to the Gainey Foundation's generous donation to our Environmental Arts
    programming, we were able to provide arts programming to 1,065 students during the
    2013-1014 school year along with a bussing subsidy. Students loved using natural
    materials to produce beautiful works of art.
  - A total of **637 student teachers** participated in environmental education workshops at the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre during the 2013-2014 school year.
  - This is the fourth year we have partnered with Trent University in creating a unique "Eco Mentor" Program. Student teachers participate in a series of in-depth workshops on environmental education delivered by Trent Faculty and Camp Kawartha staff. These workshops take place at the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre. Students graduating from this program receive an <a href="Eco-Mentor Certificate">Eco-Mentor Certificate</a> from both Trent University and

Camp Kawartha. The certificate tells future employers that these future teachers have the skills, knowledge and expertise to be their schools "Eco-Mentor." By June, 2015 we'll have graduated more than **200 student teachers** from this program. We are delighted to report that the model of environmental education for student teachers is now being used by **4 other post-secondary institutions**. Paul Elliot, a Camp Kawartha Board Member and a Professor in the School of Education at Trent University presented our Eco Mentor approach to teacher training at the **North American Society of Environmental Education** at a conference in Ottawa this past fall.

- This has been an excellent year for renting the facilities out to user groups with an
  environmental focus. 1,469 participants made use of the Environment Centre as a
  destination for workshops. Examples include: Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources,
  Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society, Peterborough County-City Health Unit and
  many others besides.
- In 2012, we introduced our "Oaks and Acorns" program. Specifically geared for parents
  and their toddlers, we provided a weekly opportunity for young families to explore the
  natural world at the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre. This past year we logged 648
  visits!
- This is also the second year for Forest Fridays a program designed for homeschooling families. This year, 16 Friday sessions took place, logging 240 visits. This program provides a venue for homeschooled children to participate in in-depth nature and environmental programming. Kids discovered wetlands, made forts and explored the many trails around the Centre.
- We were able to offer a March Break Environmental Camp and four one week summer
  day camp sessions to children from the ages of 6 to 12. These sessions had a waiting
  list. Activities included Nature Art, Exploration, First Nation Awareness, Sustainable
  Living, Story Telling and Music. Over 150 campers participated in these camps. As well
  we piloted a week long "Wild Clover Camp" for kids between the ages of 3 and 5. That
  represents an increase of more than 30% over last year.

And finally we'll end with the words of those campers, students and visitors who are impacted by Camp Kawartha. It is what they have to say, that makes our work worthwhile!
