WHAT WE DO

Camp Kawartha is an innovative environmental learning camp, dedicated to fostering stewardship in the Greater Peterborough community and beyond. Camp Kawartha has been in operation since 1921. We've been a not-for-profit charity since 1985. Over the past 8 years, Camp Kawartha has earned 11 awards for its work in promoting outdoor and environmental learning.

Reaching over 10,000 participants per year, we help children, youth and adults acquire the skills to enjoy the outdoors, and we teach sustainable living practices, habitat protection and environmental responsibility.

Our core programs:

Summer Camp

Providing magical overnight experiences for children of all ages, we teach skills to help children appreciate and enjoy the environment. We offer day camp, one, two and three week overnight sessions, leadership and tripping programs. We also work with local cottagers' associations to provide outreach environmental camps.

Outdoor Education


We offer over 50 curriculum-linked programs to students from Kindergarten to grade 12. Program offerings follow under 5 broad headings: Environmental Science, Canadian History, Environmental Arts, Adventure and Leadership, Recreation and Physical Education.

Environment Centre

In partnership with Trent University, we provide over 30 curriculum-linked programs to elementary and high school students focused on sustainable living and ecology. We also provide workshops on environmental education to student teachers and to the general public.

Facility Rentals

We also rent our facilities to user groups for weekend retreats, conferences, family reunions and weddings.


STATS (OCTOBER 2014 - SEPTEMBER 2015)






Summer Camp Survey 2015 Q10 How would you rate your overall experience with Camp Kawartha?



Camp Kawartha received the County of Peterborough 2015 Recognition Award for Sustainability. That's 11 awards over the past 8 years!

Summer Camp 2015


This was the biggest summer camp on record! We had:

- **577** overnight campers,
- 325 day campers
- **52** Leadership Campers

This represents an increase of **15%** over last fiscal year.

We've recently added several new programs for younger campers including Kinder Day Camp, CK101 101 (an 3-day/2-night introduction to Camp) and CK Overnight (a new 1-night overnight camp. We also developed a comprehensive Parent Manual which

helps parents and campers know what to expect when enrolling their children in our summer camp program. The tremendous testimonials bear witness to the difference we are making in promoting confidence and self-esteem, fostering nature awareness and helping children



to respect and care for one another. Please see their comments at the end of this report.

Outreach Camps

As a way to increase our reach, we've developed partnerships with the Association of Stoney Lake Cottagers and the Wollaston Cottager's Association. We provide a total of 5 weeks of environmental camps for **82 campers**. Together with our environment camps offered by the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre, that makes for a total of 234 additional campers learning about environmental stewardship.

Outdoor Education Programs

Over the past year, we've revised and expanded our outdoor education program offerings. The intent is to not only link programs to the Ontario Curriculum but to articulate key stewardship values and to ensure that each program delivers on these. We've also created a stewardship framework showing how environmental knowledge, skills and values can develop throughout all the grade levels. A new brochure and program

guide provides an overview of the various programs Camp Kawartha provides teachers and students from Kindergarten to Grade 12. Between the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre and the Camp Kawartha Outdoor Education Centre, we offer over 80 curriculum related programs!



Facility Rentals

Our facility rentals grew by 22% over last year. Revenue generated through weekend rentals helps to support our environmental programming.

Environment Centre



Located at 2505 Pioneer Road next to Trent University, The Camp Kawartha Environment Centre continues to be a wonderful catalyst for all kinds of environmental education opportunities in our community.

Here are some highlights:

- 2,387 elementary and high school students participated in environmental programming during this past year.
- A total of 4,183 campers, students, student teachers and adults visited the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre this past year.
- Since opening, the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre has directly taught 14,262 High School and Elementary students about sustainable living, energy conservation and ecology. More than 2,234 University Students and Student Teachers have participated in environmental education workshops and we've recorded 30,800 visits to the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre (a total of tours, students, student teachers and rental groups over the past 5 years).
- A total of 402 student teachers participated in environmental education workshops at the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre during the 2014-2015 school year.
- This is the fifth year we have partnered with Trent University in creating a unique "Eco Mentor" Program". Student teachers participate in a series of in depth workshops on environmental education delivered by Trent Faculty and Camp Kawartha staff. These workshops take place at the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre. Students graduating from this program receive an Eco-Mentor Certificate from both Trent University and Camp Kawartha. The

certificate tells future employers that these future teachers have the skills, knowledge and expertise to be their school's "Eco-Mentor." By June 2015 we'll have graduated more than **240 student teachers** from this program. We are delighted to report that the model of environmental education for student teachers is now being used by 4 other post- secondary institutions. Our Board Member and Professor of Education, Paul Elliot presented our Eco-Mentor approach to teacher training the a **World Environmental Education Congress** in Gottenberg, Sweden this past summer.

- This has been an excellent year for renting the facilities out to user groups with an environmental focus. 553 participants made the Environment Centre a destination for workshops. Examples include: Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources, Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society, Peterborough County Health Unit and many others besides.
- In 2012, we introduced our "Oaks and Acorns" program. Specifically geared for parents and their toddlers, we provided a weekly opportunity for young families to explore the natural world at the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre. This past year we logged 505 visits!
- This is also the second year for Forest Fridays a program designed for homeschooling families. This year, 16 sessions took place, logging 495 visits. This program provides a venue for homeschooled children to participate in in-depth nature and environmental programming. Kids discovered wetlands, made forts and explored the many trails around the Centre.
- We were able to offer a March Break Environmental Camp and five one-week summer camp sessions to children from the ages of 6 to 12. These sessions had a waiting list. Activities included Nature Art, Exploration, First Nation Awareness, Sustainable Living, Story Telling and Music. Over 170 campers participated in these camps. As well, we ran two one-week long "Wild Clover Day Camp" sessions for kids between the ages of 3 and 5. That represents an increase of more than 20% over last year.

Be a Watershed Steward

We are proud of our partnership with the Otonabee Region Conservation Authority (ORCA). Since 2012, we have planted over 31,788 square metres of shoreline, we've enhanced 24 planting sites and we've taught more than 1,500 students about the importance of watersheds, water conservation and sustainable living. We've increased biodiversity and improved the health of our local watershed.

Nature Playscapes

Thanks to a generous contribution from the **Gainey** Foundation and the kindness of donors to our **crowd** source funding campaign, we were able to create

a series of interactive nature playscapes at the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre. From musical chimes, to unique climbing structures, it features elements that invite nature engagement and play. They are creative, whimsical and fun. Our thanks to Paul Patterson, who designed and built these creations. We hope the playscapes will not only inspire



outdoor play but will encourage teachers, parents and community leaders to construct their own playscapes.



Environmental Framework

Camp Kawartha is currently working with partners from local conservation authorities, land trusts, faculty of education, public health, school boards, parents and educators to create an environmental framework for our region. This is a call for the whole community to determine what each child needs throughout their development in order to become an environmental steward, and to make sure that the whole community is involved in providing these experiences. We are working to establish clear stewardship benchmarks with our community members. Whether it means being caretakers of nearby green spaces, raising monarch butterflies, working as citizen scientists or learning about sustainable living, the camp is inspiring our whole community to raise a responsible steward, one child at a time. Our thanks to Cathy Dueck and our Steering Committee, for their tremendous work in this area.





Facility Improvements

The Camp continues to invest in improving and upgrading our **infrastructure**. As always, we use the most **sustainable approach** to retrofitting that we can, selecting low or non-toxic materials, researching and implementing energy saving options and increasing biological diversity by planting native trees, wildflowers and shrubs. Over the past year, we've been able to invest over \$154,000 in **capital improvements**. Special thanks to our maintenance team consisting of **Michael Schmor** and **Jeremy Courneyea** for their hard work. Here are some highlights:

- Special thanks to GE volunteers and their "Days of Caring Program" over 80 volunteers accomplished the following:
 - Constructed new stairs to cabin cluster
 - Upgraded the exterior of 8 sleeping cabins and constructed new, larger porches on three cabins
 - Ripped up old Kitchen deck and replaced decking
 - Rehabilitated our Nature Playscapes area build bird nest, repaired large web, improved tracking area, installed feeders
 - Spread wood chips throughout camp paths
 - · Painted exterior of Rotary Hall
 - Varnished entrance gate, pillar at Rotary Hall entrance, fences, and Abby's Garden entrance





- We completely renovated the interior of three sleeping cabins. We replaced a series of old asphalt roofing with new metal roofing. Special thanks to Mike Evans and the Lloyd Carr-Harris Foundation for their generous support
- Thanks to the Williams Wilson Sherport Foundation, we've been able to upgrade our canoe and sailing fleet and to install the first ever camp wide radio station!
- We've installed a fireplace insert in our dining

- hall which reduces our carbon footprint, burns more efficiently than fireplace reducing our oil consumption
- We've replaced our ancient phone system and have upgraded the computers. Our new system now provides direct lines to department heads complete with voice mail, creating a more efficient and responsive office

Camper Subsidies & Sponsorships

Thanks to the generosity of a variety of donors, businesses and foundations, we were able to provide a total of \$80,548 in funding to help 70 children in need participate in the magic of summer camp. We'd especially like to thank the Rotary Club of Peterborough and the hard work of Judge Alan Ingram for providing Camp Kawartha with \$8,280 in sponsorship funding. Together we worked with Prince of Wales Public School, St. Patrick Catholic Elementary School, and Kawartha-Haliburton Children's Aid Society to select children whose families could not afford a camp experience.

Surf 'n Turf Fundraiser

Thanks to donors & community supporters, this year's Surf 'n Turf raised close to \$40,000. All funds raised help support our award-winning summer camp, environmental and outdoor education programming.

Total Fundraising

Camp Kawartha had a **banner year in fundraising**, raising more than **\$275,655** from individual donors, grants and subsidies. The funding provides subsidies and sponsorship dollars, assists in program development, staffing levels and facility upgrades.

Mackenzie Tour - PGA Canada

Thanks to **Glen Stonehouse** from **Wildfire Golf Club**, Camp Kawartha will be receiving \$22,000 from the **Mackenzie Golf Tour** held this past September. Two PGA golf pros visited the Camp. They participated in throwing games such as tossing an atlatl dart into a golf hole and axe throwing. In turn, they taught our Executive Director to golf. A segment of this appeared on TSNR4 and Global TV.

Ontario Trillium Grant



Camp Kawartha received a grant for stocked to the l'Ontario stocked to the location of the loc

funds are earmarked for the renovation of what our **Site and Facilities Master Plan** referred to as the "**East Cluster**." The intention of the grant is to: a) showcase green infrastructure, b) build capacity, and 3) improve accessibility. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$200,000. A business plan for the Site and Facilities Master Plan was created by Cambium Inc. in 2013 outlining the benefits of investing in the East Cluster. Construction will be completed by the end of **March 2016**.

Website

Thanks to **Karen Copson**, our recently redesigned website has increased in views over the past year from 86,556 annual visits to 97,445, a 12.5% increase. The feedback we've received from teachers, parents and rental inquiries, is that the site is much easier to navigate, professional looking and cleaner than our previous website.

Camp Store

Thanks largely to efforts of Karen Copson and our Office Staff, this fiscal year we've been able to sell a total of

\$25,648 in merchandise. That means an additional \$10,000 in revenue for the camp. We try to select environmentally friendly memorabilia for campers and students. We've expanded our product



offerings and we've enhanced our online presence, enabling parents to pre-order for summer. We have also developed a smoother, more efficient payments system plan. This is a welcome and growing stream of revenue for the camp.

Adventures in Understanding

This is the second year of a unique partnership between Camp Kawartha, the Rotary Club of Peterborough-Kawartha, Curve Lake First Nations and the Canadian Canoe Museum. Conceived by Rotarians Don Watkins and Janet McLeod, 10 First Nations and non-First Nations Youth participated in a five-day canoe trip focusing on First Nations history and cross-cultural awareness. Led by our own talented Glen Caradus, the program was a great success. Several articles appeared in the Examiner and the story was picked up by CBC on Ontario Morning.



Travel Writers

In June of 2015, Camp Kawartha worked with **Peterborough & the Kawarthas Tourism** and Bear's Lair winner "**The Land Canadian Adventures**", to run a special 4-day canoe trip for travel writers as part of an international conference.

Cell Tower Update

In the November 2014, Camp Kawartha was informed that Rogers wanted to install a 305 foot tower directly adjacent to the Camp. Over **80 letters of protest** were written by neighbours, colleagues, friends and stakeholders. We recently heard that as of the writing of this report, Rogers has no plans to construct the tower in this location.

FUTURE PLANS

Camp Kawartha is excited about embarking on the next phase of our Master Plan. We look forward to becoming a provincially significant environmental leadership centre for youth. The key elements of this demonstration plan can be summarized as follows:

- Upgraded facilities to showcase sustainable living practices.
- An expanded central hub to include new interconnected dining, kitchen, dormitory and washroom/support facilities.
- A new parking area located near the existing main entry drive.
- A renewed and expanded east cabin cluster to complement the existing west cabin cluster.
- An enhanced upper and lower "common" area, intended to improve the natural character and identity of the camp.
- A site-wide ecological restoration effort.

Camp Kawartha is working with its partners and donors to develop a provincially recognized environmental leadership centre for youth. By providing examples of innovation in action – from strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, to promoting sustainable building practices and energy conservation - we help inspire future leaders to create a greener, more sustainable economy for Ontario
