

Clothing

Students will be outside for the majority of the day. Please remind them to dress appropriately for the season and weather.

- **Cold weather** Students should dress in layers. Hats and mitts or gloves are required and when there is snow on the ground warm winter boots are a must.
- **Hot weather** Students should bring a hat and sunscreen. Closed toe shoes are required. The best defense against insects is light weight long sleeves and pants.
- Wet weather/Water Programs Rain boots are highly recommended. The Centre can be muddy and most of the wetland areas do not have boardwalks so proper footwear can make the day more enjoyable.

Teacher & Volunteer Support

Please support our staff while you are at the Environment Centre in the following ways:

- At the Environment Centre, we have the same behaviour expectations as in a classroom, please discuss this with students ahead of time.
- Our educators aim to facilitate engaging programming and are excited to interact with your students. Please assist them by addressing any behavior issues or challenges that individual students may present during the day ie. pulling a student aside if needed.
- Please communicate ahead of time with the CKEC staff if there are any accommodations requirements needed or behavioral issues to be aware of.

Parents and Teachers Take Note:

BEEware: Camp Kawartha is proud to house an observational bee hive. With plexiglass walls, this observational hive is designed to encourage students to view bees at work from inside the Environment Centre. The bees enter the hive from a PVC tube located high up on the exterior of the building. Honey bees play a critical role in helping to pollinate plants. With a variety of apple trees near the centre and pollinator gardens, the bees will help to ensure that there will be a healthy harvest of apples this fall.

We'd like to remind all visitors to the Camp Kawartha Environment Centre that there are always bees, wasps and stinging insects in any natural area. Please ensure that any students with allergies to bees come with the appropriate safeguards in place (an epipen – if required, antihistamine tablets etc.). We'd also like to remind visitors that there are some patches of poison ivy in the vicinity of centre. Closed toed shoes, long pants and hat (sun protection) are also highly recommended as well.

Tick Me Off: Though ticks (and Lyme Disease) are not very common in this area, there have been a few ticks reported at the Trent Nature Areas. Lyme disease can become a serious infection caused by a bacteria spread by the bite of blacklegged ticks (formerly called deer ticks). We highly encourage all families to do **TICK CHECKS** at the end of the day and to get in the habit of doing so after **every outing in the woods**. This is part of helping children to build solid routines around tick awareness and Lyme prevention.

The Peterborough City County Health Unit recommends a TICK CHECK when coming in from the outdoors:


- Have a shower to rinse ticks off
- Woods clothing should be placed in the wash or hung outside
- Either with a loved one or alone with a mirror check your body thoroughly for ticks.
- Make sure to look in hidden areas like the scalp, between toes, armpits, back of knees, groin, behind ears
- Please remember that ticks can be tiny freckle sized or as large as a small grape when engorged.
- If a tick is found, put it in a screw top bottle or zipper closed bag and bring it to your local Health Unit

Prevention: A good rule of thumb is to cover up exposed skin in wooded areas: wear closed toed shoes, long sleeves and pants, and pulling socks over pant legs. In addition, wearing light coloured clothing will make ticks easier to see. Insect repellent containing DEET should be applied to skin and clothes. After being outdoors, remember to check yourself and others for ticks and/or tick bites daily.
